Spring has sprung and all the "Beer Can Series" are in full swing! This is the time of year when many people get hooked on recreational boating. So many people enjoy boating activities year round in the Southern California coastal waters. It's what makes us different than the yacht clubs in the Midwest and East Coast, with the exception of Florida.

We're looking forward to one of the biggest offshore race events of the year. The 2019 Transpac will be the 50^{th} Anniversary of this race. This race was first run from San Francisco to Waikiki in 1906 with just three entries. Ordinarily, there are 50-60 entries every other year. This year, there are 108 entries, which really takes a lot of volunteers and resources to host all of these additional boats at the starting area in Long Beach and in Waikiki.

Waikiki Yacht Club is also celebrating their 75th Anniversary. They will host a party sponsored by Mount Gay Rum and Hawaii Yacht Club will be hosting a Transpac Party as well. Yours truly will join many others flying to Oahu for



the Transpac finish. Whenever our boat arrives, we'll meet them at the dock with Mai-Tais and treat the skipper and crew to breakfast, lunch or dinner, depending on the time of their arrival. All boats will be utilizing the Yellow Brick Tracker which will upload each boat's location to the satellite every four hours, so we should have a fairly good idea on when to expect their arrival. Aloha and we'll see you on the water!

Mainland Hosts For
The Transpac Race

2019 is the 50th Transpac Race and it is now the largest fleet in the history of the race.

Come to Long Beach this July to see the starts for one of the greatest sailboat races in the world today.

As in the past, Shoreline Yacht Club will help host the mainland end of the race. this year Long Beach Yacht Club will be partnering with them. They are responsible for helping send-off of the fleets on each of the start dates July10th, 12th, and 13th.

Transpac Yacht Club will also have its bienial send off party at Gladston's next to Pine Avenue Pier on July 6, 2019. Shoreline Yacht Club will host a "First Starters" party at their on July 5th, 2019.

Recreational Boaters of California is requesting that the County of Orange take action to protect access to the county's beaches and docks for public safety and recreational users. RBOC has contacted the OC Parks, the Orange County Sheriff's Department, Patrol, and the California Coastal Commission, requesting that the County of Orange:

- 1. Restore full access to including the "72 hour Dinghy Dock" and the "20 Minute Loading Dock" at the Orange County Parks Facility located at 1901 Bayside Drive in Corona Del Mar.
- 2. Maintain public access to the beach and docks via water and land for public safety and recreational users.

There are no other public docks on the Corona Del Mar side of the Harbor. Furthermore, there are few public docks in Newport Harbor and they are all highly impacted. RBOC's request follows the reported actions taken by the Orange County Sheriff's Department Harbor Patrol that have shut down docking areas at its Newport Harbor headquarters.

At issue is the protection of public access to coastal beaches and waterways. These protections, set forth in the state Coastal Act, apply to the California Coastal Commission permits that have been issued to the headquarters at 1901 Bayside Drive.

The change in access to the two docks at 1901 Bayside has had (and will continue to have) a negative impact on boaters, guests of boaters, harbor enthusiasts and mooring users in the County of Orange.

RBOC is requesting restoration of full access to these two docks which community has enjoyed and relied upon for the past many years.

Spinnaker classes are open to members of SCYA affiliated Yacht Clubs or Associations who hold a current PHRF or Corinthian rating certificate. Cruisers, Multihulls, Martin 242s, Vipers and other one design classes are invited; at least three entries will constitute a class. One Design and Multihull entries must fulfill the eligibility requirements of their class.

Entrants shall complete the online entry process at http://www.regattanet-work.com/event/14076. Registration can be performed at KHYC from 0900 until 1030 on race day. The entry fee is \$25.00, with a \$5 late fee for entries on race day, or \$120.00 for the entire series.





Mainland Gears Up for Transpac

Long Beach has traditionally been the starting point for the biennial Transpac Race. This event which ends at Diamond Head in Hawaii celebrates its 50th race this year, which dates back to its inaugural run in 1906. Transpac will be staging boats primarily in Long Beach beginning around July 1, 2019 for the race which has three start dates. The current start dates are Wednesday, July 10th, Friday, July 12th, and Saturday, July 13th. The start line is located at Pt. Fermin.

SYC has traditionally provided volunteers to host each participating boat and assist skippers while in Long Beach. The club provides individuals to circulate the skipper's packets and trackers prior to the race. They also man the Pine Avenue Pier for a big Aloha sendoff for each boat on their respective start dates. SYC hosts its own party for the race called the "First Starters" Party. This event is for the smaller boats whose skippers and crews are generally new to this race or are doing it for the first time. The club also provides spectator and media boats at the start line.

Since 2005, Shoreline Yacht Club has been one of the mainland host for this event. This year more than one hundred boats will participate, coming from all over the world. Shoreline Yacht Club is proud to participate with Los Angeles YC, Seal Beach YC and Long Beach YC's in helping provide the necessary support until the boats are on their way.


