



Stuff from Sacramento **John Marshall** **President, R.B.O.C.**

The result of the November 6th elections has given the Democrats an uncontested super majority in Sacramento. Expect more overreaching legislation that could impact recreational boaters. The need for a voice for recreational boaters in California has never been more apparent. RBOC continues its advocacy for recreational boaters that will now surpass 50 years. Here are the Policy Priorities of incoming


Governor Gavin Newsom:


- **Education** - Renewing California's commitment to education, from preschool through higher education
- **Housing** - Addressing the state's affordability crisis and ensuring every Californian has a place to call home
- **Child Poverty** - Eliminating child poverty in California and expanding opportunity for every child.
- **Economy** - Building an upward and inclusive economy for everyone, not just areas that are already better-off
- **Environment** - Leading the nation in environmental protection
- **Civil Rights** - Defending the civil rights of every Californian and standing up for California's values against threats from Washington

With the inception of the 2019-2020 legislative session on December 3rd, 2018, legislators have begun introducing the first of an anticipated 2,500 new measures that will be introduced prior to a February 22, 2019 deadline.

The first legislative session started in November and they're reviving the "No Smoking on State Beaches" for the THIRD TIME! It's already been vetoed twice by Governor Brown for "overreaching". I wonder if incoming Governor Newsom noticed that? The Senate Bill 8 [Glazer] would make it an infraction punishable by a fine of up to \$25 for a person to smoke, as defined, on a state coastal beach, or in a unit of the state park system, or to dispose of used cigar or cigarette waste on a state coastal beach or in a unit of the state park system unless the disposal is made in an appropriate waste receptacle.

Beginning January 1st 2019, the RBOC presidency transfers to the Northern region and will reside in the capable hands of Ray Durazo of the Half Moon Bay Yacht Club. The RBOC General Meeting and installation of officers will be at Half Moon Bay Yacht Club on Wednesday, January 9th, 2019.







King Harbor Christmas Regatta

THE KING HARBOR YACHT CLUB breathed a sigh of relief and gratefully settled for light winds and dazzling sunshine instead of the predicted weekend of rain for their annual Christmas Regatta.

Three hundred boats hunted for pockets of wind that interestingly carried some last place starters into first place finishes. Visibility was excellent and the ocean so flat on Sunday that wind patterns could be seen hitting fleets, jumbling positions, and leaving them in a flat spot again. Talk on Saturday night was mostly comparisons of the windless holes along the South Bay beaches.

Greatest hole of all was around the leeward "T" mark just before the up draft finish on Sunday afternoon. Pacific Handicap Division A and B, Ocean Racers, Multi-hulls and portions of seven classes of keel boats were intermingled after a two mile downwind sail toward shore. Most fleets were on a two lap course, thanks to the foresight of race committee chairman Peter Nootboom who planned to shorten the course if necessary after the first lap through the finish line. The shortened course flag drooped at 3 p.m. and Peter found even one lap was too long.

An additional race committee boat was summoned to intercept and finish fleets as they rounded the reaching weather mark. The Challenger Fleet of seventeen boats were finished, and fired up their engines to return to King Harbor. A sprinkle of Cal-24s, Schock-25s, and Feathers had passed the mark and continued to race until the sundown rule cancelled their fleet finishes.

Centerboard classes racing off Torrance Beach under the direction of race committee chairman Carol Whitney had to cancel the last finish on Sunday. Sundown saw the big boats gathering up the small boats. Jack Weber and his H-28 *Apollo* had a string of six Lido-14s silhouetted against

the setting sun.

Commodore Larry Gray awarded most of the seventy-nine King Harbor Y.C. Christmas Regatta Trophies before seven o'clock; but the handicap racers had to await a Monday race computation.

The four classes who were first-time entries in the annual race were Cal-20s, Cal-24s, Cal-28s and Tempest-21s.

Closest competition in the regatta was in the Lightning Class as Dick Benner and Wendell Harter finished three races with indetical points, but Dick beat Wendell two out of the three races.

Multi-hull results found the Pacific Catamarans taking the first three places. Neil Harvey from Cabrillo Beach Y.C. was first in Top Cat; Burke Sawyer second in No. 14 for Newport Harbor Y.C.; Robert Baker third in *Copy Cat* for Cabrillo Beach Y.C.; and Jim Sharp from Palos Verdes Y.C. took fourth place in his Triad, *Tempest*.

Hervey Aldridge from the host club took first place in Ocean Racing with his Cal-30, *Carina*; and William Goodley placed second in PCC *Squall* for the Del Rey Y.C.

Pacific Handicap Racing Fleet Division A, which split at 240 seconds per mile saw the *Gladiator*, *Manuka*, and Phil Murray from the California Y.C. correcting out in first place. The next two places went to the host club with Chet Weislo and *Skaal* in second place and John Condon and *Eleison* third.

Ron Amundson and his 34-foot cutter, *Fantasy*, placed first in the 19-boat entry in Pacific Handicap Division B. All trophies were awarded to the host club. Carl Benson and DC-3, *Duchess*, was second; and Bill Gulick and *Triton*, *Protege*, took third.

Bringing up the Rear John Marshall

Hi, everyone! I am John Marshall and I have the privilege of serving as SCYA's Rear Commodore for 2019. I hail from a family who was active in the sailing community back in the 1960's. My dad was a Lt. Commander on a US Naval Destroyer, the "Silver Stein" during World War II and the Korean Conflict. He was based in Norfolk, Virginia and then served in the Pacific Fleet based on Oahu, where my sister and I were born at Tripler Naval Hospital. After my dad retired from the



US Navy in 1957, we moved to San Diego. My father raced in the Penguin fleet at Mission Bay Yacht Club in San Diego and served as Commodore of Mission Bay Yacht Club in 1965.


I was raised racing a Naples Sabot on Mission Bay beginning in the 4th grade. My dad started the Cal 20 Fleet at MBYC where we won first place 37 straight times. My dad was the Cal 20 National Champion in 1965 while serving as the Race Chairman.

I got back into sailing in 2009 when our kids were off to college and my wife said I could either join a yacht club or clean out the garage. The garage is still a mess! I became the Treasurer of South Shore Yacht Club in Newport Beach soon after I complained about the length of time it took for the club to deposit my initiation fee. Soon I was moving up the chairs and served two years as Commodore in 2012-2013. I was asked to be the Principal Race Officer for The Border Run

International Sailing Event in 2010 and served as the Border Run Race Chairman for the following 8 years.

Like many volunteers, I was approached by a friend who suggested I take a leadership position in the yachting community. Pat Shoemaker of Dana West Yacht Club asked me to join the Association of Orange Coast Yacht Clubs Harbor Association for Newport and Dana Point Harbors and I served as Commodore in 2015. Subsequent to that position, SCYA appointed me as a SCYA director and as a director in Recreational Boaters of California and I served as Vice President South in 2016 and as President in 2018. I look forward to serving the Southern California yachting community in the coming years.
